



MAP READING (Cubtown Hike Map, Route 1) Leader/Helper Notes



READING TOPOGRAPHIC MAPS

The 1st Cubtown Pack is going on a hike to Heresville, to have a barbecue and campfire with the 1st Heresville Pack. The Leader has given each Cub a map (Hike Map) and asked them to study the way they will go. Because of bad weather lately, it has been decided to keep to the roads, except for one part.

Each part of the route has been carefully worked out according to the following instructions. Follow these instructions, mark the route on the map, and answer the questions relating to map information.

1	Take the east road out of Cubtown.	
2	Turn left at the cross-roads.	
3	When the road forks, take the high road over the hill, as the road by the creek is flooded.	
4	When you reach Mills Pond, take the north road and travel over the higher of the Twin Peaks.	
5	At the intersection, turn southwest.	
6	At the T intersection, take the west road and travel on past Fertons Plantation to Fenton's Mill. Stop here and take bearings.	
7	Travel east. You will see a mountain on your left. How high is it above sea level? Above ground level?	~750 metres AMSL ~400 metres AGL
8	Take the road crossing over three bridges.	
9	Continue on until you can admire the view from 575 metres (AMSL – Above Mean Sea Level). Have a rest. Where are you? How high are you above local ground level?	Bob Hill ~200 metres AGL
10	At the next fork in the road, turn west. Continue until you reach a north-south/east-west cross-roads.	
11	Take a walking track, going northwest, that passes behind the Heresville church. What is behind the church?	The cemetery
12	When you reach the road by the church, cross it and take the road into Heresville.	

Answer the following questions relating to your journey:

13	How many dams did you pass right by?	7 or 8
14	At what height, above local ground level, is the source of Mawby Creek?	~250 metres (Ground Level ~350m AMSL)
15	In what direction is the Heresville Water Storage from Cubtown?	NNE
16	How high, above local ground level, is Pill Hill and what is on top of it?	150 metres. Trig Point. (Ground Level ~350m AMSL)
17	Which is higher, Cob Hill or Bob Hill?	Cob Hill (600m AMSL). Bob Hill is 550m AMSL
18	<p>Which other ways could you have walked if the weather had been good? Keep to established roads and tracks.</p> <p>i) Take given route to Rob's Corner. Track behind Wingate Farm. Along road to Fenton's Plantation. Track through to Mill. Take road over first bridge over Mawby Creek, then track to left at Cob Hill. Up to Potter's Road, then route as given.</p> <p>ii) Take given route to Rob's Corner. Along road and take track through Fenton's Plantation to Mill. Travel NNW along Quarry Road then track over Darby Creek to main road into Heresville.</p> <p>iii) Take given route to Rob's Corner. Along then track to the Mill. Take north road, then turn NE to left of Dolby's Peak. Track up to Water Storage corner, then track across Darby Creek to main road.</p>	

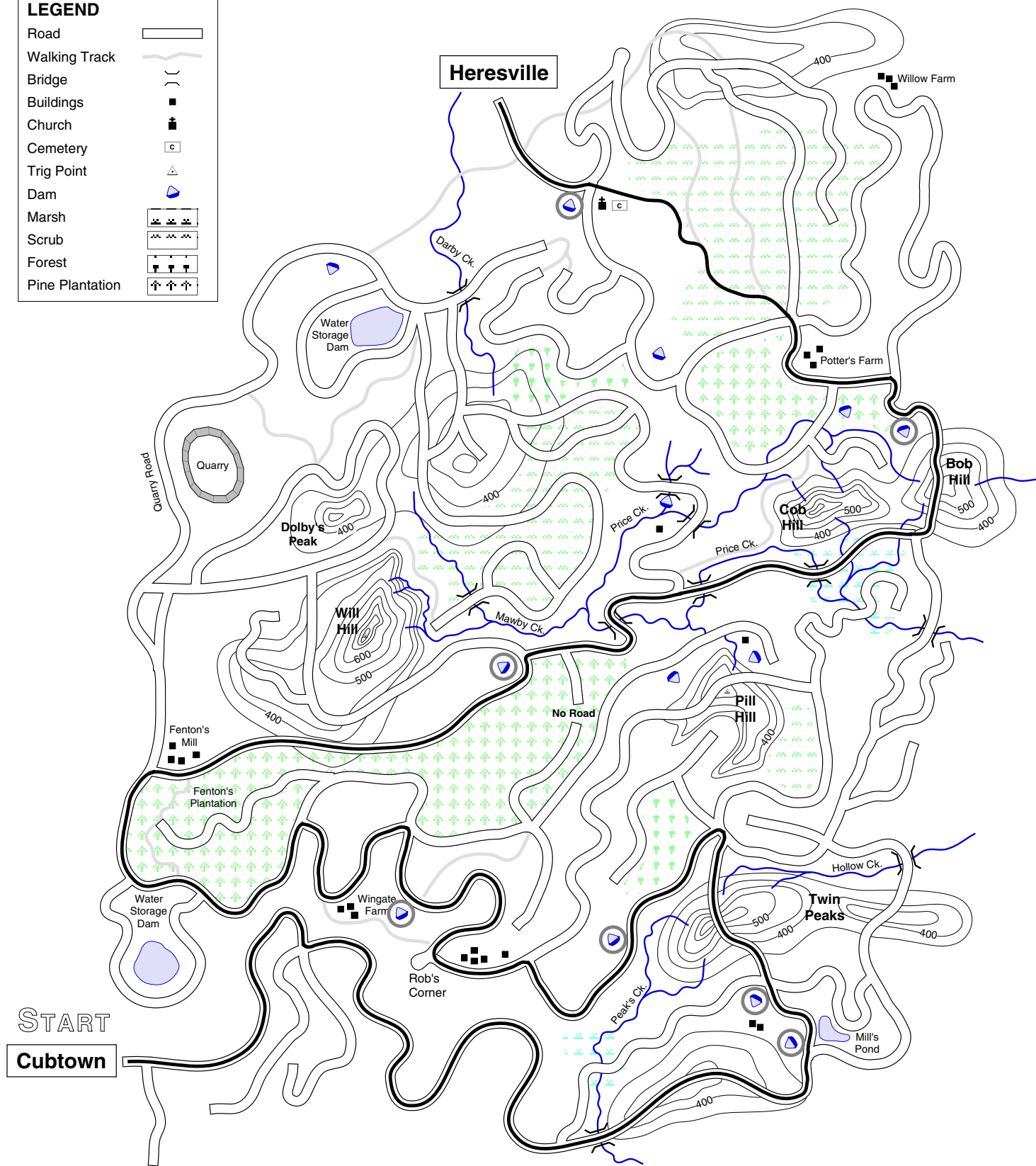


Hike Map
