



## CUB SCOUT BOOMERANG (BRONZE) TEST 10 – DISCOVERY GROWING SEEDS

*Grow seeds on cotton wool and observe the results over a two week period.*

### Resources

- Tray
- Cotton wool balls
- Seeds
- Record sheet

### Instructions

1. Place cotton wool balls, one per seed *type* to be germinated (*i.e.* if you are going to germinate 3 different seed types, use three separate cotton wool balls), in the tray (milk bottle bottom) provided;;
2. Saturate the cotton wool balls with water—they should be wet, but not floating in water;
3. Place 2 or 3 seeds of one particular type (wheat—shorter brown seed, oats—longer brown seed, or beans—round green seed) on a moistened cotton wool ball, and place on the window sill, or somewhere well lit and not cold where you will be able to observe what is happening easily;
4. Note any changes in the seeds each day, for 14 days, at around the same time, on the sheet provided. Either describe what you see (e.g. No change; white shoot appearing at seed end (or middle); shoots grown to 1 cm (or however long they might be); shoots turning green at end; second shoot appearing at seed end (or middle) *etc.*) or draw appropriate pictures of the seeds. Use one column for each different seed type, as labelled.;
5. The seeds should be watered each day, over the observation period, to ensure that the cotton wool balls remain moist.

### Resource Preparation

#### Tray

Simply cut the bottom off a plastic 2 litre milk bottle. In NSW and ACT, the 2 litre milk bottles have a small ridge about 2-3 cm from the bottom—cut just above this ridge. All that is required here, though, is something to keep the small amount of water required to keep the cotton wool balls moist.
